




5. % of C -Section performed Public out of total institution delivery









6. % of C -Section performed Private out of total institution delivery






7. Maternal death April –Nov 21-DHS data







In new HMIS, five data items- Hospital OP, Hospital IP, ILI, SARI, Fever greater than 7 days are collected on daily basis.



Monthly Data Reporting Status in RCH


Eligible Couples

Number of Eligible Couples Registered in RCH Portal During April to December





Sharpe decline is seen in the number of EC registered in this period for the three consecutive years




