In Private Health Facilities

- Worlds **biggest** COVID vaccination drive.
- Priority groups decided by NEGVAC
- Launched on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2021.
- Nearly 6 Lakh doses administered to HCW & FLW in the State.
- Excellent support from Private sector in Phase one

- Age appropriate groups included from 1st March 2021.
- a)  $\geq$  60 years (as on 1<sup>st</sup> January 22)
- b) 45-59 years with any of the specified comorbidities (45 years as on 1st January 22).
- Very large Cohort.
- State aims to cover the target group in shortest time possible
- Further engagement of private sector needed.

#### Private Covid Vaccination Centre(PCVC)

- 1. All Hospitals empanelled under the PMJAY/KASP
- 2. All Hospitals empanelled under the CGHS.
- 3. All Hospitals empanelled under the health insurance scheme(s) of State.
- 4. All private hospitals as decided by the State Health Department.

# Prerequisite

#### To be verified by District RCHO

- 1. Sufficient Cold Chain equipment and capacity.
- 2. Sufficient rooms/space for waiting area, vaccination and observation post vaccination.
- 3. Sufficient number of trained vaccinators and verifiers
- 4. Ability to manage the Adverse Events Following Immunization (AEFI), as per the norms and guidelines of the Ministry.




#### General Points to remember

- Liquid vaccine
- Freeze Sensitive
- To be stored at 2-8 C

- The COVID19 vaccines would be provided by the district while other logistics will be made available by the private hospital.
- Only COVID-19 vaccines to be stored in identified equipment at private facilities **no other items or vaccines to be stored**
- Ensure that all Cold Chain Equipment (CCE) are functional and have continuous power supply
- Twice daily monitoring of CCE temperature to be ensured and monitored by CVC Incharge
- Contingency plan for vaccine storage in cold boxes or shifting to alternate locations to be prepared in case of power supply issues or other contingencies
- In case of any CCE break down, **RCHO** to be immediately informed to support safe storage of vaccines


COVID Vaccine storage in ILR/ domestic refrigerator

#### Please remember to:

- Follow safe injection practices
- Date and time of opening of vials needs to be written on the vial.
- All open vaccine vials need to be **discarded after 4 hours of opening** or at the end of session, whichever is earlier –
- These discarded vials will be stored in a separate box clearly marked as "Used COVID-19 Vaccine vials for observation as per AEFI guidelines" and discarded after 48 hours of completion of the session as per biomedical waste management guidelines.
- Unopened vials from the previous session have to be used on priority in the next session



#### CVC Manager

- Each CVC will have a CVC Manager.
- The CVC Manager will be registered by the DIO.
- He/ She will be responsible for all operations at the CVC, as per the Operational Guidelines and SOP shared from MOHFW and State.
- To ensure adequate logistics arrangement/ deployment of trained HR as per Guideline.
- Management of vaccine stock.
- Management of CoWIN portal including scheduling sessions and ensuring all vaccinations are recorded on CoWIN

#### Each Session to be managed by a 5 membered vaccination team.

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## Adverse Event Following Immunisation (AEFI) Management & Reporting

#### Each PCVC to be:

- Equipped with Anaphylaxis kit/AEFI kit.
- Linked to a AEFI management centre.
- Adequate transportation facility (ambulances and drivers) ensured
- All AEFI-Minor, Severe & serious is to be reported through CoWIN.
- 30 minutes observation after vaccination mandatory.

• The cost of the vaccines received by the hospital @ Rs 150/- per dose, is to be deposited immediately by these hospitals, in the bank account created in this regard.
